## Getting in Touch and Tuning In

- Attending services by Zoom on the phone. If you have only phone access, this is how you can listen in to our services. Dial (996) 900-6833. Then, when the automated announcement asks for your "meeting ID," enter 916 483 9283 and then press #. It may ask you for a second ID code but you can ignore it. You may have to enter # one more time. If you hear an error message, just enter the meeting ID one more time. For your first time, you may want to be early in case there are glitches. But if you don't hear anything right away, we may be a little delayed in starting. We thank everyone for the gifts of patience and humor!
- Attending by Zoom without a camera. If you have a computer without a camera, you can still watch the services, even though others can't see you during Coffee Time. You can even type comments in the chat box on Zoom! But if you decide you'd like to order a camera to attach to your computer, we recommend email Dirk or another IT consultant for guidance and recommendations. Maybe it's even time to get an inexpensive laptop!
- **Facebook Live.** We provide our live services by Zoom but also try to stream them using Facebook Live, which reaches all users who have "liked" our UUSS Facebook page. However, Zoom is a more interactive platform.
- **Technical assistance**. If you've tried the above or you've tried logging in by your computer, tablet or smart phone and are still having trouble, be in touch with Rev. Lucy or with our IT wizard, Dirk Tuell.
